

Samoa trip for two

Johannesburg. - Five young South Africa lawn bowlers have been selected as a youth squad from which a final team of two will be selected to represent South Africa at the Commonwealth Youth Games in Apia, Samoa from September 5-11.

The side will be one of each gender (aged 14-17), to be announced by April 12. They will compete in singles and as a mixed pair at the Games.

They are: Kimberley du Preez (Sables), Scott Fraser (Natal Inland) Andrew Marshall (Ekurhuleni), Aimee Schnetler (Kwazulu-Natal) and Rowan Watkins (Southern Free State). Unsuccessful candidates will be invited to the National Under-25 later this year.

Says Bowls SA president, Allan Freeman: "Squad members must forward results of exercises under the control of their respective coaches in the next few weeks to the national coach. The exercises required will be sent to personal coaches immediately."

All squad members must immediately apply for passports and abridged copies of their birth certificates. Copies of these documents must be forwarded to Jacqui@bowlssa.co.za once received from the Department of Home Affairs. Squad members are all to complete and return the Bio Data Forms, sent under separate cover to Jacqui Atkinson before the end of **this week**. These forms are required by SASCOC to accredit the squad members.
